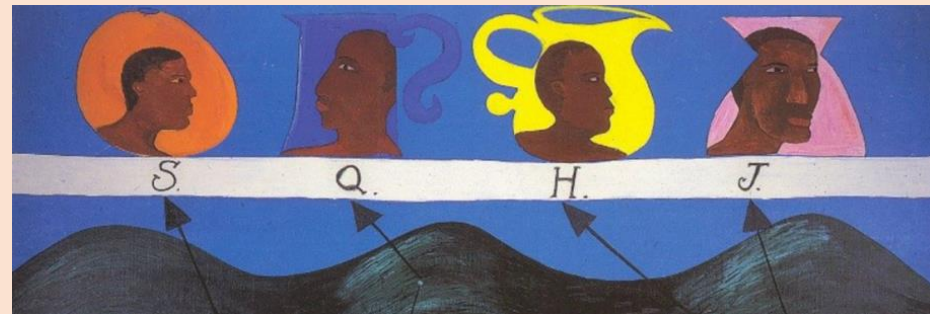

Black Humanities

Join Bristol's world-leading Centre for Black Humanities as we examine the histories, creativity and intellectual legacies of Africa and its diasporas in current debates around race and the humanities.



- 16 June to 6 July 2024 (3 weeks)
- 10 UK credits
- Open to Arts, Humanities & Social Science students
- Explores history, Black feminisms, Black radical thought
- Visits to museums, galleries around Bristol & Bath plus an excursion to Tate Britain (London)



Black Humanities

Your summer school is delivered by a community of scholars affiliated with the **Centre for Black Humanities**. There are three different types of session that you'll participate in:

- 1. Seminar sessions:** These will be a blend of lecture/seminar style group learning which will generally take place on campus.
- 2. Site visits:** These will take the shape of walking tours and more specific site visits. These will often include a chance to engage with folks outside of the University - curators, artists, archivists, etc.
- 3. Skills sessions:** Alongside the content-based learning that we will do together, in our skills sessions we will focus on building specific skills that are valuable to us as scholars in the Humanities. These include, but aren't limited to, visual analysis, close critical reading, archival research and object handling.

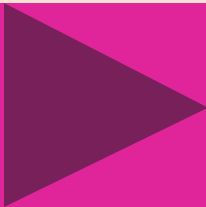

Identity and Nationhood through the lens of Wales

- Long-standing three-week cultural and academic programme in Aberystwyth University in Wales, credit bearing 3 US credits
- Small seaside market town, home of [Centre for Welsh Politics and Society](#), hub of the national [Welsh Institute of Social and Economic Research and Data](#) and location of National Library of Wales
- Combination of taught sessions, roundtable discussions and field trips including Welsh Assembly, Castles, Museums and meetings with political representatives
- Study impact of economic and social changes, migration, structural and political reforms on national identity and shifting perceptions of Welsh identity and nationhood
- Social science / politics course suitable for keen, interested students from any discipline
- Assessment via presentation and reflective journal
- Fully inclusive costs – room, board and organised outings covered, sports centre membership included, housing in single study bedrooms on campus

Fulbright St Andrews Summer Institute 2024

- This year's course offering for Fulbright students is *Scotland's History: Kingdom, Nation, People*
- St Andrews' School of History ranks in the top 50 university history departments worldwide
- The course covers four major topics in Scottish history:
 - Scotland's emerging national identity in the 11th and 12th centuries
 - Scotland's relationship with Europe in the Middle Ages
 - Scotland in the Renaissance
 - The history of the Scottish military

Practical Information and Student Life

- Students will be provided with accommodation in one of our student residences, the David Russell Apartments
 - Apartments offer a private bedroom for each student, with a double bed and private ensuite bathroom and shower
 - Cooking facilities are shared by groups of five students

Fulbright Scotland Summer Institute 2024 - Technology, Innovation and Creativity

Location – both institutions are located in the City Centre of Glasgow and are in walking distance from accommodation and to all major attractions in Glasgow and shopping.

Accommodation (Blythswood House) – provided by Glasgow School of Art – opened in 2015, flats have 6,7 or 8 rooms and are all ensuite with a shared kitchen/lounge. There is also a communal games/cinema room and laundry facilities (pay as you go).

Stipend – all participants will receive a stipend to their bank account in advance of arrival, this stipend is for food and drink. The amount is currently TBC. Participants will be required to budget accordingly for their time abroad. A number of meals are provided

Support Services – Residential Staff – out of hours, access to Libraries, other support as requested or required
