Appendix

a: "Full-time, degree-seeking students" are defined as those students who are either currently enrolled full-time in credit-earning classes or participating in college-approved off-campus studies programs.

b: "Legal sex" refers to a student's sex as reported to the US federal government.

c: The "four groups" ethnic categories are used internally at Carleton. For the purposes of this field, "students of color" are defined as domestic students who identify, even in part, with a non-white racial/ethnic identity.

d: The "US Geographic Origin" categories include only those students who are US citizens residing either in one of the 50 states, on a US military base, or in a US territory or possession.

e: Students with "Waiver of senior residency" status are not enrolled and in residence on campus. They may be participating in a 3-2 program, may have completed all degree requirements, or may be completing final requirements, such as comps.
