Appendix

a: "Full-time, degree-seeking students" are defined as those students who are either currently studying full-time on Carleton's campus, participating in remote learning, or participating in college-approved off-campus studies programs.

b: The count of "first-year" students includes all students in the first three terms of their academic progression at Carleton, "sophomore" the second three terms, "junior" the third three terms, and "senior" the remaining terms.

c: "Legal sex" refers to a student's sex as reported to the U.S. federal government.

d: The "four groups" ethnic categories are used internally at Carleton. For the purposes of this field, "students of color" are defined as domestic students who identify, even in part, with a non-white racial/ethnic identity.

e: The "U.S. Geographic Origin" categories include only those students who are U.S. citizens residing either in one of the 50 states, on a U.S. military base, or in a U.S. territory or possession. The remaining students are counted as N/A.

f: Students with "Waiver of senior residency" status are not enrolled and in residence on campus. They may be participating in a 3-2 program, may have completed all degree requirements, or may be completing final requirements, such as comps.
