

Expense Policy

In accordance with Carleton College policy, volunteers may receive reimbursement of expenses incurred while conducting College business. Volunteers may submit their travel expenses either for reimbursement or to receive a letter from the College that they can use for tax purposes. We no longer transfer the equivalent of those expenses from the AAF/Alumni Relations office budgets to the AAF for individual gift credit.

The college does not wish to limit the participation of any volunteer because of financial restrictions. Alumni engagement is important to the College. Our goal is to ensure that all volunteers can participate, not necessarily to cover all the costs associated with attendance. Please note that you will need to pay up front for your associated travel expenses. You can be reimbursed for the following expenses:

- <u>Air Travel</u>: The cost of your three-week advance-purchase round-trip coach airfare. We encourage you to purchase the lowest available airfare from your home city. We have a general guideline of \$400 or less for fares but recognize that from some cities fares may be higher.
- <u>Transportation between the Minneapolis/St. Paul airport and campus:</u> Round-trip cost of transportation up to \$200. We encourage volunteers to carpool when possible.
- <u>Car Travel:</u> Mileage between your home and campus at 14 cents per mile (the IRS-approved rate for volunteers), or the cost of a three-week advance-purchase round-trip coach airfare, whichever is less.

The following are considered ineligible expenses for reimbursement. However, you may be able to deduct these types of expenses on your taxes:

- Travel between your home and your local airport; airport parking
- Lodging en route to a meeting (if you drive long-distance to campus)
- Food and beverages en route, other than those provided during the business portion of the on-campus meeting
- Airline fees for checked baggage
- Mileage, if you've rented a car (mileage is included in the cost of most rental cars)
- Care arrangements for children or pets
- Gifts for hosts (e.g., if you stay with friends or relatives)

Please note that the IRS requires original receipts for all expenses for the College to process a reimbursement. We would appreciate receiving your expense statement within 30 days.

Alumni Engagement Terms to Know

<u>Alumni Association Awards:</u> awards granted to Carleton community members through an annual nomination process

- Distinguished Achievement Award: recognizes exceptional achievement and impact within the field or fields of professional accomplishment, non-professional pursuit, or volunteer service.
 This honor is intended for living alumni of the College, and preference is given to those in the Reunion classes.
- Exceptional Service Award: recognizes exceptional service that contributes substantially to the well-being of the College by furthering its purposes and programs. Individuals currently serving the College as employees, trustees, or council members are not normally eligible, but can be nominated if they have retired or completed their service. This recognition is not restricted to alumni and may include friends, faculty, administrators, or others who have served the College.
- In the Spirit of Carleton Award: honors Carleton alumni from the most recent 15 classes who
 have made significant and/or transformational contributions to civic or professional
 organizations and who demonstrate the attributes of Carleton's liberal arts education.
 Recipients show initiative, creativity, purposefulness, and a commitment to quality and
 improving their community.

Affinity Groups:

- 'C' Club: alumni who lettered in varsity athletics during their time at Carleton.
- 'C' Club Hall of Fame: recognizes and honors Carleton letter winners, coaches, and others who have made outstanding contributions to athletics at Carleton College.
- Carleton Young Alumni (C'YA): C'YA is a group dedicated to helping connect Carls in their first 10 years after graduation. C'YA hosts events and provides support for new alumni as they connect with their class, current students, and other young alumni.
- Multicultural Alumni Network (MCAN): Carleton's network of alumni who are Black, Indigenous, and People of Color. MCAN exists to broaden and support the College's overall educational, admissions, career, and fundraising programs, particularly as these programs relate to the enrichment of its students and alumni of color.
- Out After Carleton (OAC): Carleton's network of LGBTQIA+ alumni; OAC exists to forge a
 lifelong connection between and among Carleton and its Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender,
 Queer, Intersex, Asexual+ (LGBTQIA+) and Queer, Trans, Black, Indigenous People of Color+
 (QTBIPOC+) alumni and to serve as an agent of positive transformation and change in the lives
 of current students, former students, the College, and our communities.

<u>Alumni Council:</u> the umbrella organization that represents the many alumni stewardship efforts of the College. It acts as a catalyst for new initiatives; fosters communication and collaboration between the various alumni efforts; and provides recognition to those alumni and others who, through their efforts both with respect to Carleton College and the greater community, actively demonstrate an outstanding achievement and substantial volunteer service.

<u>Alumni Directory:</u> a digital catalog of Carleton alumni used to update personal contact information and connect with fellow alumni and/or students.

Campus Events:

- Carleton Alumni Volunteer Experience (CAVE): a volunteer training weekend for Reunion Committees, Alumni Annual Fund Volunteers, and Alumni Boards.
- Homecoming Weekend: a fall tradition that brings together current students, alumni, faculty, staff, and community members to celebrate school spirit; October 17-19, 2025.
- Maize & Blue Daize: an annual week of Carleton pride and philanthropy education for alumni, students, families, and the campus community.
- Our Family Gathering: a campus alumni gathering co-hosted by Out After Carleton and the Multicultural Alumni Network the weekend of October 1-4, 2026.
- Reunion: a hallmark event during which 2,000+ alumni return to campus to reconnect, reminisce, and learn about the Carleton of today.

Regional Events

- Alumni Adventures: worldwide group travel opportunities led by a Carleton faculty and/or staff member.
- Coffee with Carls: an annual, alumni-driven gathering of Carleton community members at coffee shops worldwide.
- Summer Send-Offs: optional gatherings hosted by current Carleton students, parents, and alumni to give Carleton's newest students the opportunity to come together and meet other Carls from their area who will be a part of their incoming class.

Virtual Programming:

- Carleton Connects: a free monthly online webinar series open to all members of the Carleton community that features new and notable work being done on campus and throughout the world by faculty, staff, and alumni.
- Nationwide Trivia: an annual, virtual trivia competition for Carls.
- Virtual Book Club: an online reading community and opportunity to connect with fellow Carleton alumni, faculty, and staff. The group reads and discusses one book every two months in various genres, such as lifelong learning, personal growth, novels, and other topics.
- Virtual Breakfast Club: The Breakfast Club is the second Thursday of the month and features alumni speakers on a wide variety of topics.

Volunteer Opportunities:

- Alumni Admissions Representatives (AAR): The Alumni Admissions Representative Program
 partners enthusiastic alumni with the Admissions Office to share Carleton stories, to elevate
 the College's national reputation, and to attract and recruit an applicant pool that enhances the
 character of Carleton in the quality, depth, and diversity of the student body. Alumni
 Admissions Representatives (AARs) work to connect alumni to prospective students through
 college fairs, interviews, hosting gatherings, and more.
- Alumni Annual Fund Volunteers: see "Fundraising Terms to Know"
- Career Center Volunteers: Alumni offer valuable information and experience to students regarding career paths, industry expertise, potential employers and much more. Career Center Volunteers host internships and externships, participate in CarlsChat, and recruit for jobs.
- Regional Carls Program: a program that connects alumni, students, parents, and friends of the College who live or work in a shared geographic region.
- Reunion Committee: volunteers who help plan programming, engagement, and fundraising efforts in the fiscal year leading up to their Reunion.
