

180 Carls admitted to the Class of 2027 in Early

In December, 180 students were admitted to Carleton through the Fall Early Decision program as the initial members of Carleton's Class of 2027. The admitted group includes 20 QuestBridge Match Scholars and 12 students selected as Posse Scholars in Houston. Of the Fall Early Decision students, 40 percent self-identify as BIPOC, 9 percent are international students, 22 percent are first-generation college students, 21 percent are Pell-eligible and will likely qualify for financial support from the Schuler Access Initiative, and 57 percent


