

It's hard to imagine that we have approached the halfway mark of Winter term 2023. In early January, the vintage winter weather led to travel delays in student arrivals and a later start for some. 





Convocation with St. Paul Mayor Melvin Carter

Melvin Carter is the 46th Mayor of the City of Saint Paul, Minnesota's Capital City. A fourth-generation Saint Paul resident, Mayor Carter leads with an unapologetic equity agenda. Since taking office in 2018, his accomplishments include raising the city's minimum wage; tripling free programs in rec centers; eliminating late fines in public libraries; reestablishing an Affordable Housing Trust Fund; expanding immigrant & refugee support resources; and launching an Office of Financial Empowerment. One signature initiative is CollegeBound Saint Paul, Mayor Carter's plan to start every child born in the city with a \$50 College Savings Account, starting January 1, 2020.




Student employment




