Manuscript Submission Guidelines

- Your submission must be an unpublished manuscript.
- Submitted manuscripts should include:
 - o An abstract of approximately 200 words
 - o 3-5 keywords
 - A body of literature not exceeding 10,000 words in length, excluding bibliography, abstract, figure titles, captions, etc.
 - o APA parenthetical citations & bibliography
- All submitted manuscripts should conform to the following format guidelines:
 - Times New Roman 12 point font
 - o Double-spaced
 - Standard 1-inch margins
 - File type: Microsoft Word document

Non-Manuscript Submission Guidelines

- Your submission must be unpublished.
- Submissions should include:
 - An abstract or caption of approximately 200 words
 - o 3-5 keywords
 - A maximum of 10 pages of work
- All submitted abstract/captions should conform to the following format guidelines:
 - Times New Roman 12 point font
 - Double-spaced
 - Standard 1-inch margins
 - File type: Microsoft Word document or PDF

Editorial Process

- The author sends in a submission.
- The submission is reviewed by the Editors-in-Chief. Some submissions may be rejected prior to peer review.
- Upon approval, the submission is reviewed by a small panel of Editors, who make recommendations of changes and whether the submission should be approved.
- The Editors-in-Chief decide if the submission should be published. If approved, any suggestions for changes will be reviewed by the Editors-in-Chief before being returned to the submitter.
- The author makes the necessary changes as recommended by the Editors and Editors-in-Chief.
- The Editors-in-Chief approve the revised manuscript and determine if the changes satisfy the recommended edits.
- The submission is published.
