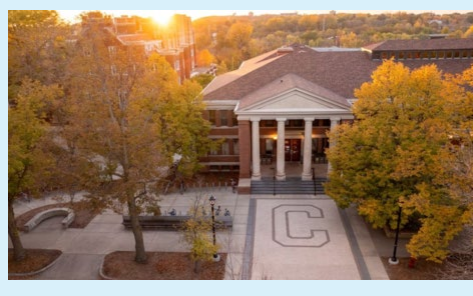
Here's your news for October from on and off campus.

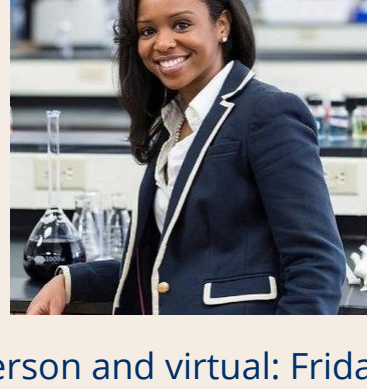
